

Request for Proposals (RFP) - Medical Education Grants

Addressing knowledge and competency gaps to improve the care of patients with multifocal motor neuropathy (MMN)

argenx supports the global healthcare community's independent initiatives (e.g., research, quality improvement, and education) to improve patient outcomes in areas of unmet medical need that are aligned with argenx medical and scientific strategies. Through this RFP, it is our intent to support IME/CME programs in the following areas of interest.

Areas of Interest

- Enhance confidence in recognizing and diagnosing MMN, and the distinction from other neuromuscular disorders
- Highlight safety and efficacy considerations around the use of IVIG, corticosteroids, and plasma exchange in MMN
- Explore strategies for recognizing and addressing declining responses to treatment interventions in MMN

Program Format Considerations

- Program to start after November 2026
- Enduring content for at least 12 months after launch of program
- Preference will be given to innovative formats as recommended by educational provider, using a curriculum approach with reinforcing educational opportunities for learners

Target Learner

- Minimum CME/CE requirement, 1 credit for all proposals
- **Educational credits in the United States**
- Neurologists, neuromuscular specialists and advanced practice practitioners
